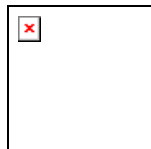

## INTRODUCTION

2009 was in many ways a wonderful year for the Green, as our Chairman Andy Lamb reported to the Annual Dinner and to the AGM. It was of course our 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary year and we marked that with various events including the very successful cricket week at the beginning of September. Fundraising was difficult with a recession in full swing but the clubs financial position was more or less kept stable despite several investments in new equipment.

On the field the club had a record breaking season. The young 1<sup>st</sup> XI, led by Tim Williams for the first time, finished as runners-up in Division One, a country mile ahead of the third placed team. Tim's side pushed for the title all the way and it took an unbeaten season and a record points total for Pershore to eventually win their deserved promotion. The very young 2<sup>nd</sup> XI under new skipper Judd Doughty won the Division One 2<sup>nd</sup> XI title after a nailbiting race with Astwood Bank. The 3<sup>rd</sup> XI suffered from not being able to field consistently strong enough sides but the mighty 4<sup>th</sup> XI under captain Dick Brown also won their Division – Four South 2<sup>nd</sup> XI's – after an equally tense race with Canon Frome. The Evening League Team under Jez Clarke won no less than three cup finals. Both Sunday sides also enjoyed good seasons.

We were blessed with a superb overseas player - Nick Murphy - and especially pleasing was the number of young players who progressed and shone at all levels. Some of the oldies didn't do so badly either.

Last but not least, congratulations to Roy Mayo and the grounds team – our North End Lane ground came 2nd in the independent umpire's assessments for pitches and first overall in the League. Also, many thanks to Andy Wheeler and his helpers who made the Newland surfaces much improved in the past year or so.

So, 2010 has a lot to live up to. However, as Tim explains below, and as will become clear if you read through this newsletter, the club is in good shape and has plenty of plans in place to enable us to go into the new season with optimism.

## NEW NON-TURF NET FACILITY AT NORTH END LANE

As you probably know we plan to build a new 3 lane enclosed non turf net facility to replace the existing nets at North End Lane.

Thanks largely to tireless efforts by Andy Lamb we have now been successful in securing an ECB grant to cover much of the very high cost of the facility.

We have directly benefited from being ClubMark approved and for being a Focus Club, as without such status the ECB grant would not have been forthcoming. The net project has been a key target in our Club Development Plan logged with the ECB at regional and national level and so they have supported it.

You might like to know that the ECB has in the past year had requests from clubs for grants totalling £220 million versus an available pot of only £40 million, so they have certainly perceived us as being a priority club for support, and we are grateful for it.

We are also extremely grateful to be getting very generous support from the Joanna Brown Trust towards the costs of the excellent new facility (see below for further details about the Joanna Brown Trust).

## **THE CLUB CAPTAIN PREVIEWS THE 2010 SEASON**

After a fantastic season for the club last year we are looking to build on our success. This means for the 1st XI working even harder in a bid to go one better and gain promotion to the Birmingham & District Cricket League. Make no mistake this will not be easy. Plenty of other teams in Division 1 will have the same idea and will be recruiting and training hard in order to make that next big step. Division 1, once again, promises to be an extremely open league and one where the team that plays the most good cricket will almost certainly prevail.

The effect of Nick Murphy was huge and leaves some big shoes to fill. We have been working very hard on the overseas situation with some extremely exciting options being presented to us - again we have been looking to secure a fast bowler with batting potential...see the article below for the result. Finally, Andy Ford will be completing his time at Cardiff University and hopes to be able to commit more time to the club.

All in all it promises to be another exciting season for the club and hopefully one in which we rise to new heights. Nothing will be taken for granted and we are all fully aware that it is a new season and past achievements count for nothing and that hard work and good performance count for a lot!

BGCC have pulled off a major coup by securing the signing of up and coming Jamaican all rounder Andre Russell. 21 year old Russell is a fast bowler and middle order batsman with 7 1st class matches behind him already. This included a match for a Jamaica XI vs. the touring Australians in 2008 when he took the wickets of Andrew Symonds, Brett Lee and Phil Jacques and also scored 25 in the second innings.

Described by former West Indian Test Match captain Jimmy Adams as genuinely quick and an extremely hard worker Russell will be experiencing his first summer in the UK and was very pleased to take up the opportunity offered to him by BGCC.

The signing puts to an end a frustrating 3 month search for the overseas player for 1st XI captain Tim Williams. He said 'I am very excited to be able to welcome Andre to the club and the signing signals a clear intent from the club that we wish to go one better this year. ## **BGCC COLTS OUTLOOK FOR 2010**

This policy will be further addressed in 2010 with the selection committee to be chaired by the Senior Cricket Manager (Andy Harris). Progression of players coming "up" through the structure must also be a priority."

## **CRICKET TOUR 2010**

It is planned to organise a Cricket Tour this year, after a break for the Cricket Week in 2009. The aim is to base the tour in the Cardiff area. Further details will be available soon.

£85 if paid after this date.

NOTE: players will not be eligible for selection if sub not paid by 31<sup>st</sup> May.

Subscription for Over 18 students and the unwaged £35.

Please pay your subs ASAP to Ian Scullion who will be coordinating subs collection this year.

### SENIOR MATCH FEES 2010

Match fees £5.00 (£3.00 for the unwaged).

REMINDER – as last year, any player delivering a minimum of £150 of new sponsorship to the club by 1<sup>st</sup> April will receive their 2010 subscription FREE.
